

OMPASS Towing with an EV: What caravanners need to know



Did you know there are now **over 1.5 million electric vehicles** (EVs) on UK roads?

With the number continuing to rise, there has been growing interest in electric vehicles among caravan owners, too.

But towing a caravan with an electric vehicle does come with some challenges.



The distance you can travel on a charge is **reduced by approximately 50%** when towing.

The average weight of a caravan is **around 1,500kg**, so it's no surprise that range is significantly reduced when towing.



Charging while on the road also **costs more**.

Cost per 100 miles towing (based on 2.5 mi/kWh):

£3-£5

Home charging

£10-£18Public rapid charger



And many charging points **aren't equipped** to deal with having a caravan in tow.

But things are getting better...

There are now over **80,000 public EV chargers** across the UK, with more caravan-friendly sites being added every month.

However, lots of charging points won't have caravan–friendly bays, but **Fastned**, **Gridserve**, and **Tesla Superchargers** are beginning to introduce them across the UK.

This means you need to plan your trip carefully.

Practical tips for EV caravanners

Whether you already have an electric car, or are thinking about buying one, follow these tips:



Check your towing capacity

Not all EVs can tow – check the VIN plate or manual and follow the 85% rule.



Plan your route

Use apps to find caravan-friendly chargers and avoid 11am–1pm peak times.



Pre-plan with access in mind

Choose chargers with room to manoeuvre or unhitch easily.



Use hitch extenders

A-frame extenders help reach chargers without unhitching.



Travel off-peak

Avoid charger queues by setting off early or travelling later.





Expect extra stops

On a 250-mile trip, plan for two 30–60 minute charging breaks.



Unhitch when needed

Most chargers aren't caravan-friendly – be prepared to disconnect.

Check destination chargers

Call ahead to campsites to confirm charging options and costs.



Charge safely

Use only approved EV chargers, not the caravan hookup.



Drive smart

Stick to 50–60mph, use cruise control, and brake smoothly.



Watch your weight

Stay within the payload limits of 150–170kg.



Scout charging hubs

Use maps and reviews to check charging bay layout and reliability.
